I have painted many landscapes, several from photo reference, but as often as I can, I go out and paint en plein air (on location). Every painting I make teaches me something, and in this article I share some of the most useful tips I have learned about landscape paintings. Most of these things I've learned the hard way, making mistakes and ruining some paintings. I'm sharing them in the hope that they can serve as a short-cut for other artists.
